A record number of scholarship applications were received and over \$200,000 will be awarded to our students in 2017. Scholarship recipient selection is an intensive yet rewarding process. Reading about the different cultural, educational and lifestyle challenges our naval aviation dependents experience and conquer is truly inspiring. This is a great opportunity to get to know our scholars as well as gain some insight into the education and goals of our current and future leaders.

This has been a record setting year for WOASF fundraising events! The kick-off event was the A Cappella concert in Virginia Beach in November.
