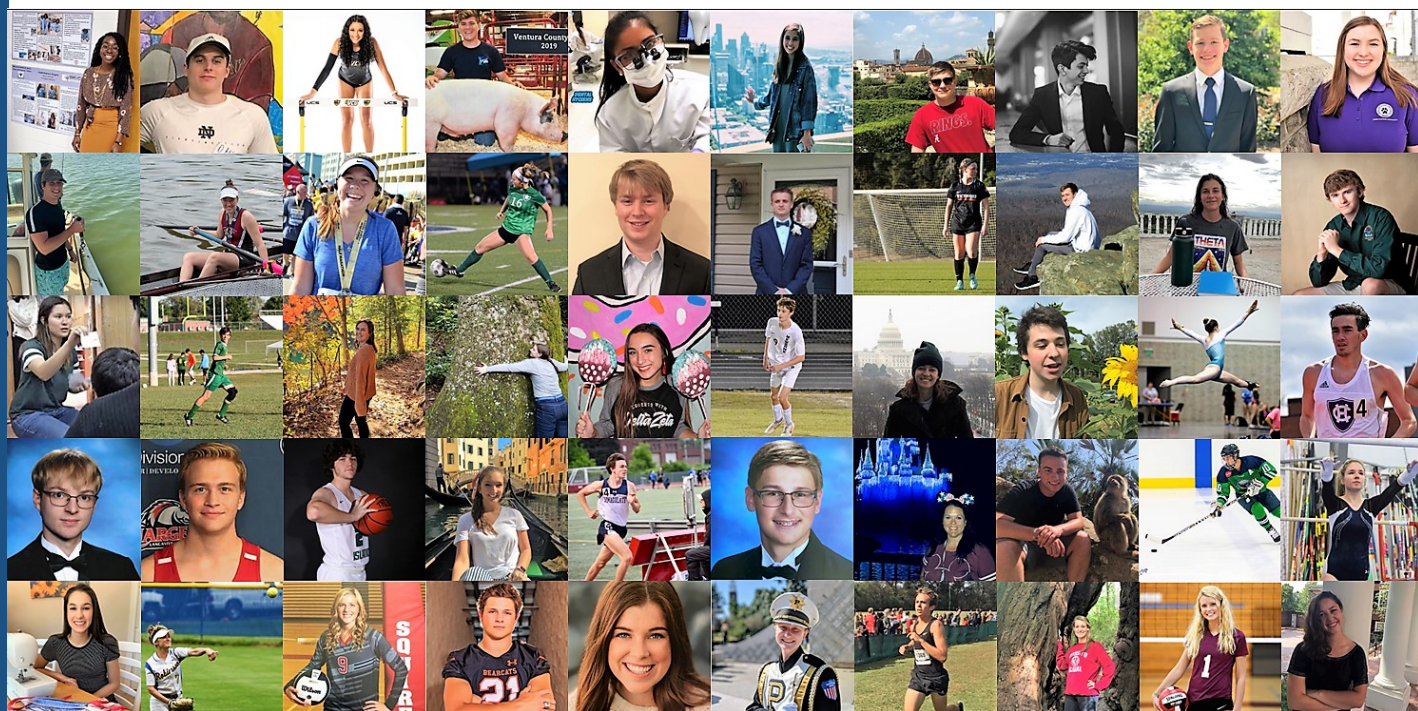

Happy Autumn! As the students begin a new school year and the weather begins to cool, we at WOASF look back in awe at the year of changes and successes.

The WOASF board of directors recognize the increasing financial needs of our dependents pursuing postsecondary education. To make a real difference for students faced with the financial burden of skyrocketing tuition, the foundation is committed to increasing scholarship awards annually. I am pleased to say through the continued generosity of WOASF supporters, the foundation remains on an upward path. Once again, WOASF in conjunction with our administered scholarship partners awarded record amounts to students with over \$285,000 in scholarship awards.

Forced to move into the digital world, WOASF embraced technology! The blind selection process was completed by WOASF volunteers online for the first time in the foundation's history. With over 150 applicants this dedicated group selected 50 amazing students to receive WOASF awards as well as 35 students to receive awards from our administered partners.

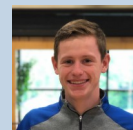

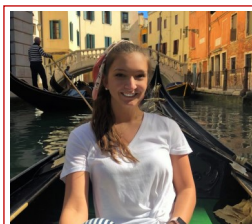

Administered Scholarship Program

WOASF annually administers scholarships for other aviation groups and commands. This provides a single application that covers many scholarships, so students only have to deliver one set of transcripts, recommendations, essays, etc. saving time and expense for the student.

WOASF administers scholarships for VAW/VRC, MPA, and TRA as well as Carrier scholarships funded by the FRG, CPO Mess or Wardroom.

- The Administered Carrier scholarships are for ship’s company only giving these students an extra chance to receive financial support for continuing education.
- Funds from Administered Carrier scholarships are not limited to tuition only. Funds can be used for room and board as well as school fees.
- Administered Carrier scholarships do not have the same time in service component as WOASF.

Funding a Named Scholarship FY2021

-Each **\$4600** donation to the scholarship fund in one fiscal year may be named for the donor in recognition of their support or recognized as an **Honorary** or **Memorial** scholarship named as the donor desires.

-Each **\$20,000** donation will receive a four-year renewable scholarship. These scholarships may be named for the donor in recognition of their support or recognized as an **Honorary** or **Memorial** scholarship named as the donor desires.

-Donors who wish to create a legacy celebrating or memorializing a loved one may establish an **Endowed Renewable Scholarship** that, for a donation of **\$125,000** (made over a maximum of **5** years), is structured to award a named scholarship for a minimum of 30 years.
