Denby retired from the United States Navy in 2010 after a 36-year career. He is a native of Virginia Beach, Virginia, a 1974 graduate of the University of Virginia and a 1992 graduate of the United States Naval War College.

Spending the great majority of his career in Naval Aviation, Denby earned designation as a naval flight officer in 1975 and as a naval aviator in 1983, eventually logging more than 4000 hours in the *A-6 Intruder* and over 1000 carrier arrested landings.



Significant command tours included VA-145 during Operation Desert Storm, USS Shreveport (LPD-12), USS Dwight D.
